



## Riparian Corridors in San José



- Relate to the bank and vegetative edge of a natural waterway
- Inventory 136 miles of riparian corridors
- Preserve greenery
- Benefit water
- Provide possible habitat
- Link trails

## Background

- General Plan (GP), adopted 2011 contains Goals, Policies, and Actions to enhance riparian corridors
  - GP Policy ER 2.1 addresses
     recommendations from the existing
     Riparian Corridor Policy Study
  - GP Action ER 2.6 & 2.8 suggests a new City
     Council Policy and checklist



- Habitat Plan, adopted 2013 has regulations to protect natural resources including endangered species while streamlining permits
   Title 18 of SJC Muni Code implements regulations
- Riparian Corridor Policy Study, revised 1999 addressed how development should protect riparian corridors



- New City Council Policy
- Title 20: Codify requirements

## **Proposed Options Would:**

- Maximize riparian protection through strong setbacks
- Incorporate existing bird-safe design standards
- Address safety





## Riparian Corridor Policy / Ordinance Study Work Plan - Status

### Preliminary Analysis of Projects Between 2009-2015

- 80 % of approved projects located in a Planned Development Zoning District
- Greater setbacks after
   2040 General Plan adopted
- Varying riparian setbacks (use of exceptions)



#### Example of Approved Project – Pre GP adoption in 2011

File Number PDC10-005 /PD10-004 (Brookside Estates)

Site size = 15 acres

#### Stream Type:

Guadalupe River

#### Riparian Setback:

From drip line
 77 feet average





#### Example of Approved Project – Pre GP adoption in 2011

File Number PDC07-010 / PD11-007 (Fox Property)


Site size = 29 acres

#### Stream Type:

Coyote Creek

#### Riparian Setback:

• 100 feet





Example of Approved Project – Post GP Adoption in 2011 & Prior to HCP Adoption

File Number H12-008 (101 Tech)

Site size = 12.9 acres

#### Stream Type:

Guadalupe River

#### Riparian Setback:

• 100 feet



Example of Approved Project – Post GP and HCP

File Number PDC11-021 / PD13-008 (Chaboya Ranch)


Site size = 7.5 acres

#### Stream Type:

Thompson Creek

#### Riparian Setback:

100 feet





#### Example of Approved Project – Post GP and HCP

File Number PDC12-024 /PD14-048 (Guadalupe Mines)


Site size = 8 acres

#### Stream Type:

Guadalupe River

#### Riparian Setback:

 100 feet with minor exception in one area
